

**2007 TORONTO INTERNATIONAL OUTRIGGER HARBOUR CHALLENGE
RACE RESULTS**

July 7, Saturday Races: approximately 23 km course run counterclockwise

- * NOTE: An official protest for interference was filed by captains of boat numbers K2 and K3 against boat J2.
- The protest was reviewed by the Race Director immediately following the day's competition with the team captains involved. The incident occurred about 250 metres after the race start. The Race Director saw the incident from the starter/timekeeper's position on the breakwall. Boat J2 was leading the other two boats by approximately 1/2 to 3/4 of a boat length and running approximately 10 metres to the left. The other two boats which were running nearly parallel (with K2 slightly ahead of K3) and about 3 metres apart.
- J2 on the inside line turned approximately 15 degrees to the right to take a line direct to the south point headland of Toronto Island which is on the race course.
- Both the boats, K2 and K3 did not turn parallel with the line change of J2 and collided on the right side of J2 with K2 hitting at about seat 5 of the J2 boat and K3 at about its midpoint. K2 was sandwiched between J2 and K3. J2 could not turn to left out of the way because the K2 bow was pushing it sideways from rear of its midpoint. All three boats slowed and continued in contact with each other for about 50 metres before separating.
- The steersperson of J2 had requested (yelled) for the K2 boat to give way after making the direction change to the right but there was no reaction prior to the collision. As well, K3 for some reason was unable to avoid K2 .
- During the interviews it became clear that both the steerspersons (and captains) in K2 and K3 were novices and this was their first competitive race. The K2 steers person had only steered an OC6 five times prior to this race. Water conditions were moderate at the time with a slight chop and south west wind blowing towards the race course line direction from the right.
- The J2 steers person had over 5 years experience steering and had recently successfully steered mixed and women's teams to third place finishes at Liberty in difficult water conditions and was fully aware of racing rules.
- Both K2 and K3 steerspersons acknowledged they were unaware of ECORA, CORA (and other competitive outrigger racing association rules) that clearly state

that a leading boat has the right of way and reasonable efforts must be made to avoid it if it changes direction while maintaining a leading position.

- The Race Director explained the rules clearly to them and indicated that in fact if J2 had protested officially that an interference infraction against K2 or K3 might have been upheld. The K2, K3 captains acknowledged a new understanding of the rules.
- Based on the Rules the protests were officially rejected by the Race Director. The remainder of the race continued without incident.
